The eventful fifty-year reign of Edward III saw the revival of chivalry and the restoration of national prestige following the disastrous reign of Edward II and the treachery of Roger de Mortimer. It was also when the Hundred Years War began...

Description

Setting the scene by questioning the accepted version of events following the abdication of his father, we will follow the 17-year-old Edward's audacious overthrow of his mother and Roger Mortimer. After this unlikely backdrop to an age of 'chivalry', we will wind the clock back to Edward's childhood and consider the factors that shaped his character and influenced his vision of kingship and his love of pageantry. Domestic reforms will be explored along with the founding of the Knights of the Garter. We will examine Edward's battle tactics in wars with Scotland and France, including his stunning victory at Crécy and the subsequent capture of Calais. Edward's personal relationships with his wife, Philippa of Hainault; his children; and the mistress of his final years, Alice Perrers, will inform our story. We will conclude with a consideration of Edward's achievements and the legacy of his reign.
